LIVE LICE



FRYSC/Counselor/School Nurse (per Principal designee) contacts parent/guardian to discuss:

- 1. Identification of head lice
- 2. Barriers to head lice treatment
- 3. Criteria for re-admittance to school
- 4. Consequences for failure to treat head lice

FRYSC/Counselor/School Nurse (per Principal designee):

- 1. Sends Exposure to Head Lice and/or Nits Notice to ALL students in child's class
- 2. Checks entire class and siblings for head lice
- 3. Follows Steps to Eliminate Nits and Lice in the Classroom

Student:

- 1. Can return to class awaiting parent/guardian arrival
- 2. Goes home via usual mode of transportation if parent/guardian does not arrive by school dismissal
- 3. Takes Exclusion from School for Head Lice letter and Head Lice Advice Packet home



Student returns to school with parent/guardian for recheck (If student returns to school with statement from healthcare provider JCPS personnel cannot recheck for 5 school days)

If child is free of lice and nits no action needed, **occurrence ends**.

If child has nits only, follow Nits only pathway.



FRYSC/Counselor/School Nurse (per Principal designee):

- 1. Conference with parent/guardian while student is at school & complete Referral Intervention Form
- 2. Sends student home with parent/guardian
- 3. Check CPS status with Hotline and report any head sores present (Anytime head sores are present a referral to CPS may be made)



Student returns to school with parent/guardian for recheck (If student returns to school with statement from healthcare provider JCPS personnel cannot recheck for 5 school days)

If child is free of lice and nits no action needed, **occurrence ends**.

If child has nits only, follow Nits only pathway.



FRYSC/Counselor/School Nurse (per Principal designee):

- 1. Completes Department of Pupil Personnel Head Lice Conference Referral Form and submits to Pupil Personnel along with all other supporting documentation.
- Schedules and conducts, in conjunction with Neighborhood Place Program Specialists, Head lice intervention conference with parent/guardian (if lack of response or child continues with ongoing head lice refer to CPS (See Head Lice CPS Referral Form).
