

GED[®] Working!

UPS is still hiring Adult Education students and providing round-trip transportation from Ahrens to work. Once students earn the GED[®] credential, they will be eligible for UPS's scholarship program, paying up to \$5,200 a year for college tuition.

Securitas USA is also a new member of GED Working! Securitas will hire students working toward the GED[®] credential, allowing students up to six months to complete the certificate.
