Purpose of the Comprehensive School Survey:

The Comprehensive School Survey (CSS) is an annual survey that focus on assessing the perceptions of school/workplace climate from multiple stakeholders associated with our schools and school system: students (grades four through twelve), parents, school-based certified staff, school-based classified staff, and non-school-based certified and classified staff.

Areas that are looked at by the survey:

The CSS is aligned to the *Vision 2020 in Action* for JCPS and the three pillars within the Vision: Culture/Climate, Backpack of Success Skills, and Racial Equity. Each pillar has a section of focus, or construct, in the survey. Overall, there are 24 constructs that help identify areas of strength and areas that need improvement as we work together to transform educational opportunities for each student in JCPS.

Analyzing Results:

This report provides an overview of climate and culture as it is aligned to the 3 district pillars. As you review the data, examine 1) year to year trends, 2) differences between groups of stakeholders, and 3) ask data reflection questions.

Examples of the data reflections questions:

- Do parents, teachers, and students agree on items?
- Are there any patterns in the data?
- Are there any surprising data points?

Deeper Dive:

- WHAT? (What does the data say?)
- SO WHAT? (What are the implications of the data?)
- NOW WHAT? (What are my next steps? What areas do I want to work on next year?)
